

Pilot Year 2008-2009

Joint Music Master for New Audiences and Innovative Practice **Icelandic Academy of the Arts, Department of Music, Reykjavik (Iceland)**

The 'Music Master for New Audiences and Innovative Practice' will be the first European Joint Master programme in the field of music to be developed within the framework of the Erasmus programme.

This new innovative Joint Master programme will be piloted in the academic year 2008-2009 during which each of the five participating higher music education institutions will pilot a number of compulsory and optional modules. Throughout the pilot year, mentoring and personal pathway guidance will also be offered and students will participate in the use and testing of the IT-environment, especially designed for the Joint Master.

Enrolment & tuition fee

Mentoring and Personal Pathway Development will be provided by Sigurður Halldórsson.

Sigurður Halldórsson is a cellist, chamber musician and professor at the Icelandic Academy of the Arts Department of Music. In addition to traditional repertoire Halldórsson is active in cross-over and interdisciplinary work.
